## Jefferson Success Pathway




- We released our second Community Report in November outlining the external impacts on our local schools like the lack of affordable housing as well as the progress towards our cradle to career goals
- We gave out five classroom mini-grants to inspire innovation in area schools
- We developed an online data hub for partners to use for grant writing and storytelling with their supporters
- We worked with local media contacts to tell school stories like Jefferson graduates visiting elementary schools to inspire younger students to stay in school

## Community Projects



- We continued our work managing the Jefferson Community Garden and worked with school staff to organize a Youth Farmer's Market
- We assisted a community volunteer in multiplying Book Nooks or little libraries around the Edgewater community. We now have seven in Edgewater.
- We brought partners in to lead workshops for parents on personal finance and renter's rights
- We organized the Jefferson Area Track Meet for elementary students
- We put on another successful Edgewater 5k in May
